Khatra Adibasi Mahavidyalaya : A Brief History

It was the ardent zeal for advancement and enlightenment of higher education that prompted the people of South Bankura to establish Khatra College (H.S. Unit) in 1976. The University of Burdwan has granted affiliation to Degree College known as “ Khatra Adibasi Mahavidyalaya ” in 1979 to introduce in its premises two courses, Arts and Commerce (General). The college was inaugurated by the honourable Chief Minister, Govt. of West Bengal, Sri Jyoti Basu on November 18, 1979. With this august inauguration, a new era had its beginning in the sphere of higher education in this educationally backward belt. The transformation of this college from Khatra College (H.S. Unit) to ‘Khatra Adibasi Mahavidyalaya’ has a glorious history of its own and inclusion of the term “Adibasi” is just – the mark of a sincere tribute to heroic rebellion of the tribals of this belt against British Rulers some 160 years before. The long drawn struggle has gone down in history as a great event, widely known as the “Santal Vidroha”. The institution is committed to instilling into the mindsets of the students the sense of freedom from all prejudices and insist of enhancing human values with utmost care and attention.

Far away from din and bustle of the town and situated in the natural setting surrounded by trees of various species, the campus provides a harmonious atmosphere for academic pursuits. The college is about 3 Kilometers away from the Sub-Divisional town of Khatra and located beside the Bankura – Jhilimili highway. It is under the Baragarh Mouza of the Supur Gram Panchayet.

As a co-educational institution, Khatra College (H.S. Unit) started its onward journey with the Higher Secondary section and later on with all Non-Teaching Staff, movable and non-movable assets have been merged with this institution being renamed ‘Khatra Adibasi Mahavidyalaya’.

The establishment of this Degree College has witnessed years relentless efforts. It is true that donation of people from all parts of life either in the form of cash or kind paved the way for its establishment. Donation of plots of land by some benevolent families of Supur, Maklara and Kandnasole Mouza of Khatra which deserve special mention. For this the college has now more than 25 acres of land. Donation of a big tank named as “ Biswas Pukur ” by Raja Bahadur of Khatra for cultivation of fish is a noble gesture and worthy of record.

Since inception of the institution, the college authority has been able to enhance the infrastructure in order to accommodate increasing number of students. With the gradual extension of infrastructural capacity, new subjects, carrier oriented courses, honours courses and streams are being introduced in a phased manner. Degree Science Course (General) had been inaugurated by Sri Partha De, The then Honourable Minister of Secondary Education, Govt of W.B. on 5th August 2008. The college has opened Remedial classes & Special Coaching to Entry into Services for SC, ST, OBC & minority communities with the financial assistance of UGC from the year 2010.

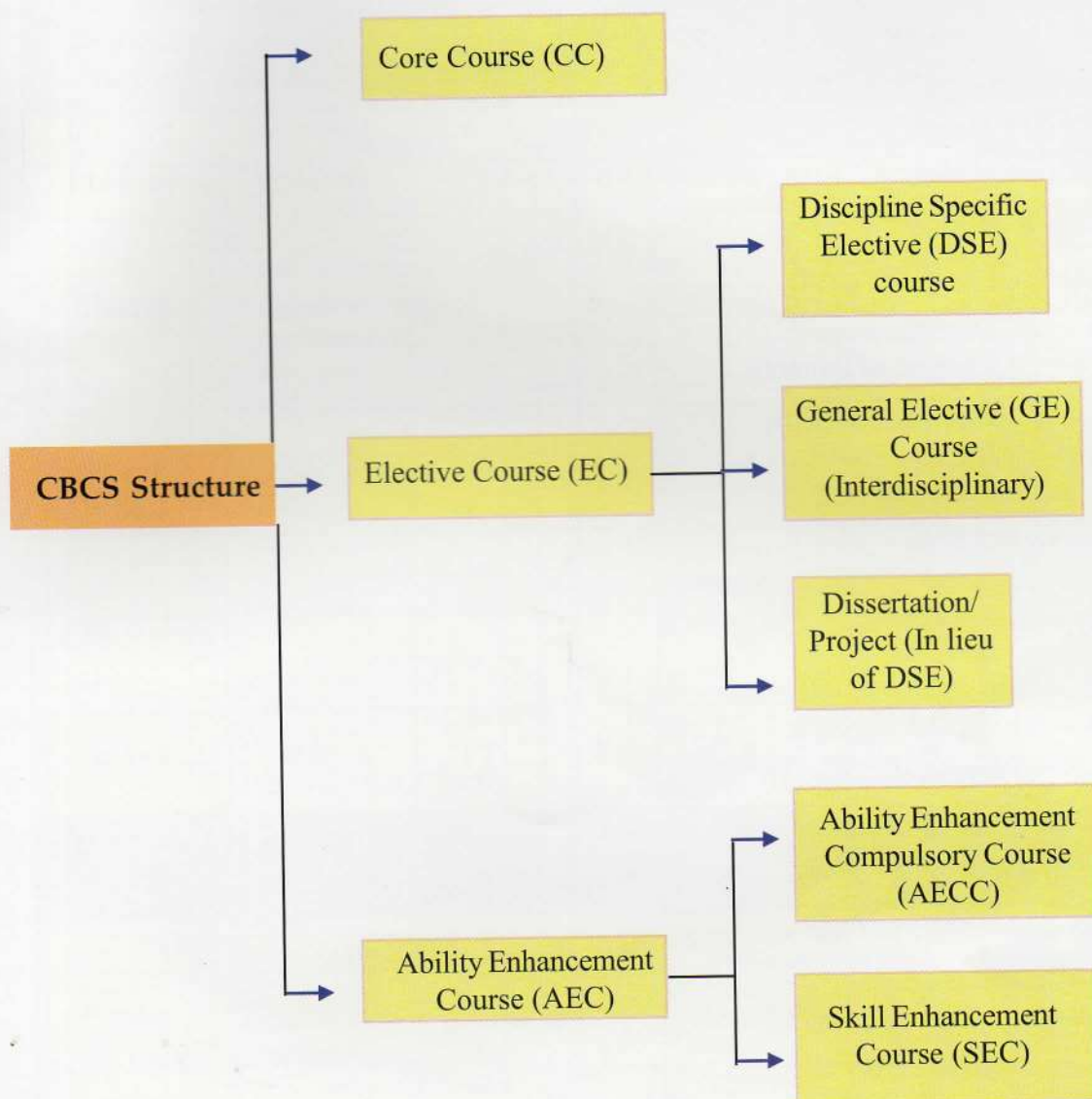

Academic activities



At the beginning of every academic year each department holds explanatory meeting presided over by the H.O.D. to distribute portions of the syllabi for each teacher. A time frame, too, is made before hand, so that the teachers have adequate time to prepare and discuss their por-

tions of the course as well as to get a feedback from the students. Midterm departmental meetings monitor the progress in this regard. Regular periodical class tests ensure that the syllabi are properly covered.

Tutorial / additional remedial classes are held. Academic calendar, issued at the beginning of the academic year, lists the teaching programmes examination dates and holidays.

Every department has projector and laptop facilities to provide better audio-visual aids to improve the class lectures.

English department provides academic cinema and creative session to create interest within the students.

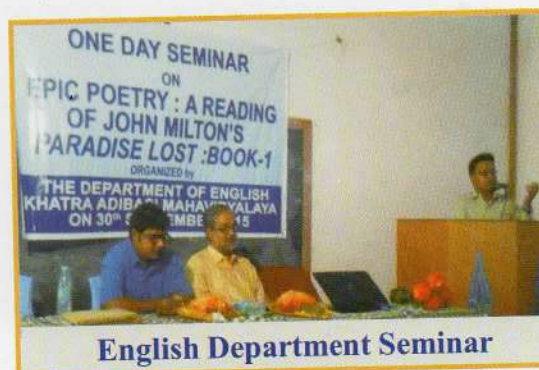

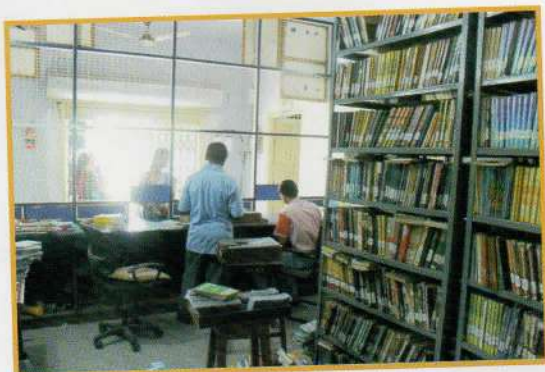
Every year top three readers of the reading room are rewarded in a prize distribution ceremony.

tive examinations carried on by different Service Commissions both under the Central and State Govt. Internate facilities are also available for the students & teachers. Central Institute of Indian Language, Mysore, MHRD also supplies various type of valuable books.

DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY

In addition to college Central Library there are some departmental libraries too.

RULES :

- All the students are eligible for membership of the college library. Accordingly a notice is served to the students just after commencement of Ist Year class, inviting application for membership within specified dates.
- Applicant must produce his/her admission receipt book and a copy of passport size photograph in library counter on those days.
- In case of loss of the library card F I R must be lodged in the local police station and a prayer for a duplicate card must be made to the Principal.
- The students of the general course can borrow two books and those of Hons. can borrow three books at a time. Failing to return books by 15 days students have to pay a fine at the rate 25 paise per day from 16th day. If a student fails to withdraw library books for three months at a stretch he/she must produce the teacher's recommendation to avail himself/herself of the library facilities again.

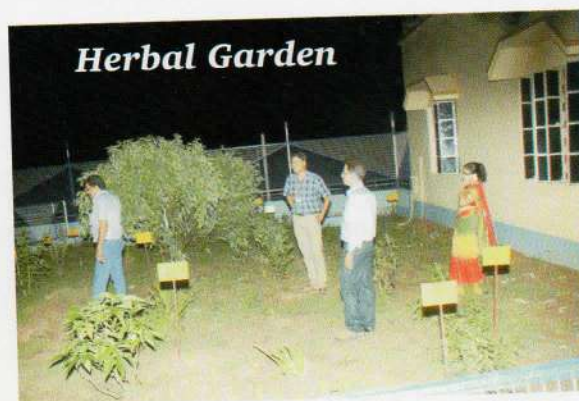
- The librarian may recall any book at any time.
- The students shall stand responsible for cutting pages, missing pages, tampering, mutilations or loss of library books.
- Borrower should borrow library books in person.
- Students should renew library cards at the beginning of the academic session.
- There is a attendance register cum suggestion book in the reading room.

Counseling Cell

The Counseling Cell for students, run by teachers, help the students to tide over difficulties that might hamper the proper development of their personality. Grievance Redressal Cell

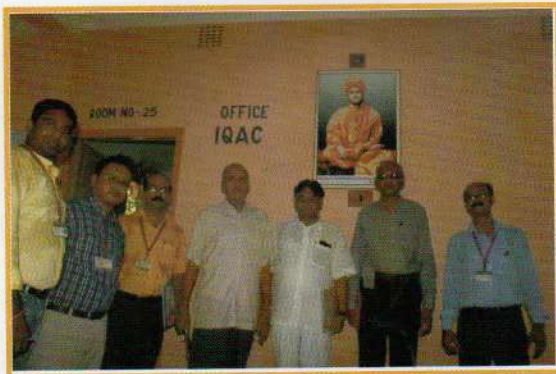

Alumni Association

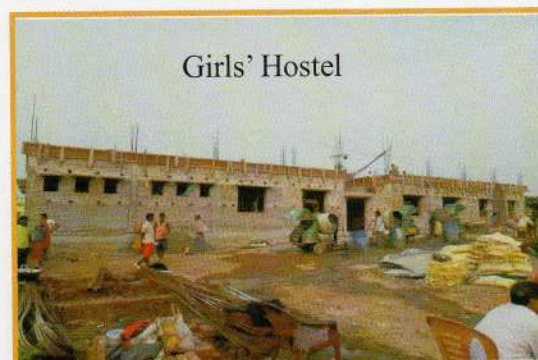
The college has an Alumni Association which has been working for few years and being enriched day by day. This association gives the college an opportunity of feedback from its Ex-students.

College Museum

At present, a number of developmental activities are being carried on by the college authority. Very recently the college has extended its infrastructural facilities for taking classes, holding examinations and other supportive services (such as, Geography Laboratory, Generator shed, modern toilets for Boys' and Girls' and Vehicle garage etc.). UGC Building (First floor) of the college with the financial assistance received from the UGC, has been completed and ready for use. The two-storied building has been completed with the financial assistance of the State Govt. The construction work of the 1st floor of the UGC Exam Hall and Class Room is completed. The most joyful achievement is that the oldest building of the college (renamed as Udyog Bhavan) has been thoroughly renovated for massive use. Construction works of a composite building with the financial assistance of the UGC and State Govt. has been completed, and named Acharya Bhavan. A two-storied hostel building for General Boys' has been completed with the financial assistance of the State Govt. The construction work of the Ground Floor





of a two-storied hostel building is completed with the financial assistance of the UGC. A noble attempt has been undertaken by the college authority to construct a fulfledged Girls' Hostel with the financial assistance of the UGC, the work will be ended soon. The main campus of the college is fully protected with boundary wall under the financial assistance of the PUP of State Govt. Recently the college has received three grants for construction of academic building, gymnasium and extension of Library building from the State Govt. The construction of the Gymnasium Hall has been already started with the financial assistance by the State Government and the Class Room building and the extension of Library Building will be started very soon with the financial assistance of the State Government.

On the 24th March 2016, we have successfully erected the statue of Swami Vivekananda within the college campus, and at the same time we took the oath of establishing a statue of Pandit Ramchand Murmu in future.

A. National Service Scheme (NSS) –

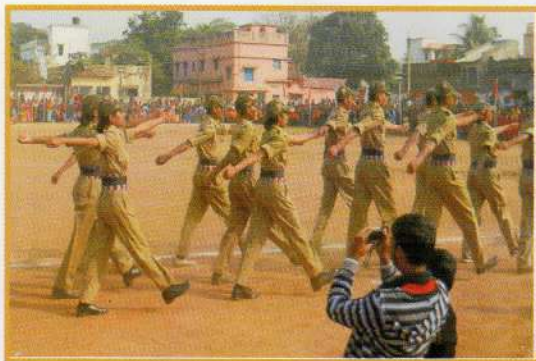

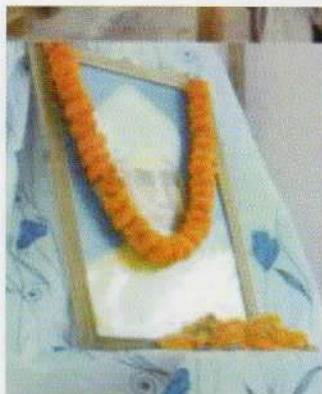
B. National Cadet Corp. (NCC) –

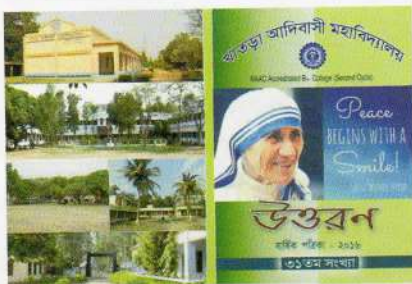
