Plan of Action: Perspective Plan

1. Opening of Online Free Access Repository comprising of Primary Texts and Secondary References, Class Notes and faculty's publications in non-editable format as a resource bank for present and future references and study.

2. Opening of a Certificate Course in Communicative English for students from other Honours departments

3. Opening a Language Lab for facilitating soft skills and personality development training

4. Engaging faculty and students in interdisciplinary lectures and project pertaining to Diaspora Studies and Migration with History Department

5. Engaging faculty and students in interdisciplinary lectures and project pertaining to Translation studies with Bengali Department

6. Engaging faculty and students in interdisciplinary lectures and project pertaining to Indian Classical Literature with Sanksrit Department



7. Organising National Seminars and Students Seminar on issues of Gender Sensitization, Popular Culture and Literature, Travel Literature, Translation Studies, Indian Classical Literature, Diaspora Studies which are newly introduced in CBCS syllabi.

8. Engage in collaborative academic ventures with other institutions like joint publication of ISBN books or journals, organizing seminars, invited lectures and preparing course modules.

9. Motivating faculty members to pursue research and publication, participating in seminars, workshops, faculty development programs, orientation and refresher courses which will enhance their teaching skills and their research acumen.

10. In addition to maintain the regular routine classes, remedial classes must be arranged for both weaker and advanced students in covering their lacuna for examinations.

11. Emphasis must be laid on ICT enabled teaching and use of multi-modal facilities for making teaching-learning experiences exciting and impactful.

12. Continuing the department's wall magazine Muse as a good practice for nurturing the creative bent of students where they can contribute self-composed poems, short story, haikus, quotes, graphics.

13. Opening a Drama Club with interested students for enacting plays prescribed in the syllabi and also as social extension programme enacting plays in our NSS adopted villages on alarming contemporary issues creating social and community awareness.

14. Encouraging cultural events organized by students to showcase their extracurricular talents involving performing arts.

15. Organise an annual quiz and exhibition on History of English Literature and inviting students and faculty from English departments of neighbouring colleges to participate in this event.

16. Ensuring screening of Shakespearean plays and other available texts as film adaptations to students with a view to encouraging them to opt for special paper on Film Studies.

17. Arranging classes on basic computer skills consisting of Microsoft Paint, Word, Excel and PowerPoint, Email, Pdf making and Scan.

18. Initiating Mentor-Mentee system for better feedback, counseling and guidance of students.
